

The Franciscan International Study Centre in Canterbury shall cease functioning at the end of Trinity Term 2017, and begin the process of closure and the eventual alienation of the property.

The Trustees expressed their hope that the Franciscan ethos and its intellectual and spiritual tradition would find new ways of expression and growth throughout Great Britain and the English-speaking world.
